

# Safe Digging Month: April 1-April 30, 2025

Every April marks the beginning of **Safe Digging Month** aligning with the start of spring when outdoor projects typically commence.

This initiative is an essential reminder for both excavators and homeowners to contact 811 at least three business days before starting any digging. By following this important step, individuals can ensure facility owners and operators accurately locate and mark underground utility lines reducing risk of accidental damage. By proactively contacting 811, an excavator not only prevents injuries but also reduce the risk of disruptive utility outages, underscoring the crucial role of safety and responsibility in excavation practices.

## Pennsylvania 811 is asking for your help.

Pennsylvania 811 is calling on community leaders, safety ambassadors, and anyone involved with underground utilities, or construction projects to support this public awareness campaign. Digging without first identifying utility lines results in injuries, loss of life, and property damage every year, often causing service outages, utility line damages and incurring fines.

### Written Communications

To make it easier when writing content for a press release, article or social media messaging, use the following information.

- Pennsylvania One Call System, Inc. dba Pennsylvania 811
- Pennsylvania 811 website is www.paonecall.org
- PA Act 287 of 1974, as amended *or* PA Act 287, as amended or Pennsylvania Underground Utility Line Protection Law (PA UULPL)
- Contact 811 at least three business days before digging
- Online locate request at least three business days before digging is www.pa1call.org/notify
- The service is free to any homeowner working on their residential property
- A small fee applies for professional contractors per calendar year for unlimited use of the service
- Pennsylvania 811 does not locate underground lines
- A tolerance zone is the horizontal space within eighteen inches of the outside wall or edge of a line or facility
- Within the tolerance zone you must employ prudent techniques, which may include hand-dug test holes or vacuum excavation
- The Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (PA PUC) is the enforcement authority of PA Act 287 of 1974, as amended <a href="mailto:puc.pa.gov/pipeline/pa-one-call/">puc.pa.gov/pipeline/pa-one-call/</a>

### Proclamations, Resolutions and Letters of Support

- A **proclamation** is a ceremonial document issued by Commissioners or Council to *commemorate a specific time* (day, week or month) for raising awareness about local efforts.
- A **resolution** is a ceremonial document that generally commends an organization for *service to the community* for a particular accomplishment.
- A **letter of support** offers recognition in collaboration with a *business* or organization's public awareness outreach efforts.

The templates are available as Microsoft Word documents. You may fill in the green areas, or edit the document to change the font color, style and type to your preference.
